**Topic:** Partnerships Between the United Nations and Relevant Regional Organizations in Peacekeeping Operations

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1 The Security Council,

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3 *Recognizing* the vital role of the United Nations (UN) and their Security Council in addressing conflicts worldwide,  
4 assisting parties to end hostilities and emerge towards recovery by mandating peacekeeping missions,

5 *Noting with deep concern* the lack of a communication system between UN Peacekeeping and regional  
6 peacekeeping operations,

7 *Recognizing* the need for an international platform facilitating exchange of experience concerning cooperative  
8 peacekeeping missions between the UN and regional peacekeeping operations,

9 *Deeply concerned* about the insufficient communication between the United Nations and its regional partnerships  
10 that leads to lack of harmonization concerning the understanding of peacekeeping operation mandates,

11 *Emphasizing* the need for a coordinated, coherent and integrated approach to planning effective peacekeeping  
12 missions,

13 *Emphasizing* the importance of gender sensitive issues in partnerships between the UN and relevant regional  
14 peacekeeping operations as stated by SC resolution 1325 (2000) and the Action 4 Peacekeeping initiative,

15 *Noting* that in order to improve cooperative missions between the UN and regional peacekeeping missions,  
16 communication between both entities shall be considered being of utmost importance,

17 1. *Aims* to enhance the cooperation and communication between the UN relevant regional organization in  
18 peacekeeping operations in order to increase the effectiveness of the missions;

19 2. *Decides*, acting concurrently with the General Assembly and in accordance with Articles 7, 22 and 29 of  
20 the Charter of the United Nations, to establish the United Nations Consultation and Assessment System for  
21 Peacekeeping (UNCASP):

22 a. Arranging at least monthly, at least virtual meetings, between UN Peacekeeping and regional  
23 operations;

24 b. Quantifying supply and demand of peacekeeping forces, equipment and training facilities;

25 c. Providing summarizing reports to the UN Secretary General, the Under-Secretary-General for  
26 Peacekeeping Operations, the respective leaders of regional peacekeeping operations and the  
27 Peacekeeping Commission as intergovernmental advisory body;

28 3. *Establishes* the Global Peace Summit, focusing on cooperative missions between the UN and regional  
29 peacekeeping operations in order to improve peacekeeping-related communication on an international  
30 level, by:

31 a. Providing a platform for discussions about successful and potential measures within various  
32 peacekeeping operations and the intensive exchange between the stakeholders;

33 b. Inviting related officials of the United Nations for example the Department of Peacekeeping  
34 Operations (DPKO) and the Department of Political Affairs (DPA), the leadership of current  
35 peacekeeping operations, chairs of regional organizations and delegates of members states;

36 c. Holding the Global Peace Summit annually on the International World Day of Peace, for the first  
37 time on the 21st September 2020 in Brussels, Belgium;

38 d. Deciding that the meeting will be organized by the DPKO and the costs will be covered partially  
39 by the hosting country and the UN Peacebuilding Fund;

- 40 4. *Requests* regional organizations and partnerships that collaborate with the UN in peacekeeping operations  
41 to participate in the drafting process of resolutions that deal with the establishment of peacekeeping  
42 operation mandates and accordingly:
- 43 a. Demands to invite all relevant regional organization to drafting sessions of the Security Council;
- 44 b. Proclaims the observer status granted to the regional organizations and that the recommendations  
45 and opinions of regional organizations are considered through the possibility to give their opinion  
46 during the drafting sessions;
- 47 5. *Calls* for the full involvement of relevant regional organizations in the planning and coordination-process  
48 of UN peacekeeping missions when the regional organization is supposed to cooperate concerning the  
49 implementation of the peacekeeping mandate,
- 50 a. Demands the UN Department of Peace Operations to involve the regional organization in the  
51 planning and coordination of peacekeeping missions,
- 52 b. Requests the respective regional organization being present during the planning and coordination  
53 meetings of the peacekeeping operations through a representative,
- 54 c. Supports the establishment of a regional office at the UN for regional organizations maintaining a  
55 partnership, established by a Joint Declaration of Comprehensive Partnership, with the UN  
56 concerning peacekeeping operations,
- 57 d. Further requests the responsible representatives of the UN and regional organizations to especially  
58 focus on the harmonization and clear coordination of policies and strategies during the planning  
59 process of peacekeeping missions;
- 60 6. *Demands* the UN and its regional partner organizations in peacekeeping to pay special attention on the  
61 monitoring and reporting of gender sensitive issues, especially cases of sexual assault, in order to enhance  
62 the communication of gender sensitive issues by:
- 63 a. Addressing gender perspectives within the work of the organizations to tackle accountability  
64 deficits;
- 65 b. Appointing a separate gender commissary to implement such communication and reporting;
- 66 7. *Decides* to remain seized of the matter.
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
