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- 3 *Recognizing* the vital role of the United Nations (UN) and their Security Council in addressing conflicts worldwide. 4 assisting parties to end hostilities and emerge towards recovery by mandating peacekeeping missions,
- 5 Noting with deep concern the lack of a communication system between UN Peacekeeping and regional 6 peacekeeping operations,
- 7 *Recognizing* the need for an international platform facilitating exchange of experience concerning cooperative 8 peacekeeping missions between the UN and regional peacekeeping operations,
- 9 Deeply concerned about the insufficient communication between the United Nations and its regional partnerships 10 that leads to lack of harmonization concerning the understanding of peacekeeping operation mandates,
- 11 *Emphasizing* the need for a coordinated, coherent and integrated approach to planning effective peacekeeping 12 missions,
- 13 *Emphasizing* the importance of gender sensitive issues in partnerships between the UN and relevant regional 14 peacekeeping operations as stated by SC resolution 1325 (2000) and the Action 4 Peacekeeping initiative,
- 15 *Noting* that in order to improve cooperative missions between the UN and regional peacekeeping missions, 16 communication between both entities shall be considered being of utmost importance,
- 17 1. Aims to enhance the cooperation and communication between the UN relevant regional organization in 18 peacekeeping operations in order to increase the effectiveness of the missions;
- 19 2. Decides, acting concurrently with the General Assembly and in accordance with Articles 7, 22 and 29 of 20 the Charter of the United Nations, to establish the United Nations Consultation and Assessment System for 21 Peacekeeping (UNCASP):
- 22 Arranging at least monthly, at least virtual meetings, between UN Peacekeeping and regional a. 23 operations;
- 24 b. Quantifying supply and demand of peacekeeping forces, equipment and training facilities;
- 25 Providing summarizing reports to the UN Secretary General, the Under-Secretary-General for c. Peacekeeping Operations, the respective leaders of regional peacekeeping operations and the Peacekeeping Commission as intergovernmental advisory body;
- 3. Establishes the Global Peace Summit, focusing on cooperative missions between the UN and regional 28 29 peacekeeping operations in order to improve peacekeeping-related communication on an international 30 level, by:
 - a. Providing a platform for discussions about successful and potential measures within various peacekeeping operations and the intensive exchange between the stakeholders;
 - b. Inviting related officials of the United Nations for example the Department of Peacekeeping Operations (DPKO) and the Department of Political Affairs (DPA), the leadership of current peacekeeping operations, chairs of regional organizations and delegates of members states;
- 36 c. Holding the Global Peace Summit annually on the International World Day of Peace, for the first time on the 21st September 2020 in Brussels, Belgium; 37
- 38 d. Deciding that the meeting will be organized by the DPKO and the costs will be covered partially 39 by the hosting country and the UN Peacebuilding Fund;
